## **2. ROLES**

### **2.1 Alliance steering committee**

Functions:

- Strategy, Action plan
- Appoints convenor, chair and other roles
- Forms sub-committees (eg. fundraising; research)
- Governance, accountability and transparency, (+ host institution/s only in secretariat capacity, non-voting)
- Agree outputs incl visibility and research
- Initiates requests for observer status at ACHPR, Economic Commission for Africa, APRM, other pan-African institutions.
- Sets and oversees conditions of participation/membership (On basis of invitation by the founding<sup>1</sup> or subsequent members: membership can be in individual or representative capacity; can be asked to leave if no participation).

Meetings commitment: 1 x a month

### **2.2 Associate members of the Alliance<sup>2</sup>**

Functions:

- Membership of subcommittees
- Give feedback to steering committee
- Support organising and participation in consultations

Meetings: 1 x 2 months

### **2.3 Subcommittees (any interested person)**

(Including competency-based standing technical subcommittee)

Functions:

- Membership of sub-committee
- Define research needed
- Supervise any contracted research

Meetings commitment:

- As required – could be at least 1 x fortnight

### **2.4 Host institution/s:**

Functions:

- Fundraise for the Alliance under mandate
- Engage an organiser

- Organiser should convene and attend all meetings
- Host institution(s) should be part of all Core Group meetings.
